## Good bargains, good cause

If you are remodeling your house or just doing a little redecorating, you may want to visit the Habitat for Humanity Outlet Stores in Dallas and Garland. The stores sell home improvement goods and home furnishings – usually brand-name, surplus or discontinued lines donated by retailers or wholesalers – at discount prices to the public. Proceeds are used by the Dallas and Garland Habitat for Humanity affiliates to build affordable houses for low-income families.

One of the most popular items is wood laminate flooring available in more than 15 styles for less than \$2 per square foot. There is a large selection of lighting fixtures and lamps. The Dallas store has ceiling fans for \$25. Both stores also carry silk draperies; ceramic tile; paint and paint supplies; wallpaper (starting at \$1.50 per roll); plumbing fixtures and hardware; and, basic items such as door knobs, cabinet hardware and tools. Furniture is also sometimes available.

Since most of the merchandise is donated, the selection may vary, so check in from time to time to stay on top of the selection at both stores. Be sure to take color swatches and measurements with you, as returned items may be exchanged for store credit within 5 days (no refunds). Items from individuals, such as major appliances, may be accepted (please call the stores for information on donations).
