## New Dallas Recycling Program

On October 1st the city of Dallas began Phase One of its new Recycling Program. This is an important step in bringing Dallas in line with other cities that are beginning to see the value and necessity of recycling.

If you could visit the McCommas Bluff landfill, you would see why we need to get serious about this. The new program's motto suggests that half of our daily garbage is just 'Too Good To Throw Away'.

One of the big changes is that you can now put all of your recyclable materials into one blue or clear bag. You may continue to put newspapers and magazines, etc. into paper bags if you like.

Blue plastic recycling bags are available free, subject to availability, at all Dallas libraries and recreation centers. They can also be purchased at most area grocery stores.

Pickup is weekly and on Thursday for most of our streets. You can call 311 to verify this or to obtain additional information.

## Recycling Specifics

The following materials may be included for Dallas recycling pickup:

- Glass all colors, all types.
- Aluminum and other metal containers, including steel, tin, and non-hazardous aerosol cans.
- Plastics #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, and #7, and non-hazardous product bottles and jugs, No Styrofoam.

• All paper, including phonebooks, junk mail and envelopes with plastic windows, milk cartons and drink boxes, paperboard, corrugated cardboard, magazines and catalogs.

No wax paper.

If it is not on this list, or if it takes too much water to clean, it goes into the garbage!
