

St. Patrick's Day MARCH 16—Special Event



This flyer explains the initiatives the city is taking to limit the impact of the St. Patrick's Day parade and party on our neighborhood. This is a result of a joint effort of Dallas Police, neighborhood residents, special events office, code, sanitation, parking enforcement, event sponsors and Council Member Angela Hunt. Note that these events are privately sponsored and are not endorsed by the City of Dallas.

The map on the reverse of this flyer shows where the "No Parking" restrictions will be in place. Temporary "No Parking" signs will be installed on one side of neighborhood streets. **While temporary signs will be posted on Thursday, enforcement will not begin until Saturday.** This map is available in color-coded format on the LGNA website at www.LGNA.net.

Resident Parking Only is in effect all day Saturday. Residents on RPO blocks must display their RPO hang tags if they park on the street.

Parking enforcement will be patrolling 9am-2am. Tow trucks will be queued to tow according to the following priority: blocked intersections, blocked driveways, no parking zones.

SPECIAL EVENT PARTY

- Time:** 10am-7pm on Greenville Ave. between Vanderbilt and Vickery. Streets close 9am-7pm. Street sales of alcohol end 6:30pm or earlier if DPD deems necessary.
- Police:** **9am-8pm:** 100 officers at event site and conducting neighborhood patrols.
8pm-3am: 50 officers patrolling the neighborhood (all paid by sponsor). Add'l on-duty patrol throughout day and evening.
- Shuttles:** Shuttle from Mockingbird Station to Lee Elementary. No alcohol or coolers allowed on shuttles. DART officers will be at Mockingbird Station to monitor.
- Alcohol:** No alcohol may be brought into event. Police DWI squad will patrol and arrest for DWI. Taxi stands will be on Greenville.
- Other:** Party is 21+ only—IDs will be strictly enforced. City Fire Inspectors will monitor maximum crowd size in the event and buildings. "Respect our Neighborhood" signs and "Don't Drink and Drive" signs will be posted. Code and Parking enforcement will patrol to cite violators.

OTHER EVENTS

The parade and concert are between Blackburn and SMU Blvd. and will not take place south of Mockingbird. However, thousands of people will walk south along Greenville and Matilda to participate in events along Lower Greenville. As well as the fenced-off block party, other businesses along Greenville may be conducting special events all day.

REPORTING PROBLEMS

- Call **911** for police, parking and code problems.
- From 9am-2am, police dispatchers will be instructed to forward all calls related to St. Patrick's Day in Lower Greenville to the police command post at Lee Elementary.

HOUSE PARTY CONSIDERATIONS

- If holding a private party, please take into consideration your neighbors and surrounding citizens. Police, Fire and Code Enforcement will be enforcing city ordinances.
- Consider shutting down bands or loud music early, prior to complaints being made. Noise may carry several blocks.
- If having an outdoor party, consider providing additional restroom facilities.
- Remind your guests to stay within the 18-foot rule to avoid an open container citation.
- Ensure your guests have safe transportation home. This is a no-refusal weekend and driving under the influence will be strictly enforced.
